There was no renewal of the rioting in Cork last night. The military were confined to barracks. There are ruinours that the troops concerned are to leave Cork. Examination shows that the damage to properly was very extensive. Captain Harris is progressing well.

Armistice Day was celebrated throughout the United Kingdom yesterday. In Dublin there were some rows. In Cork a demonstration by demobilised soldiers in memory of the dead was sympathetically received.

Speaking on the League of Nations in London yesterday, Mr. Balfour referred to the celebrations of the day, and said if a repetition of war's incalculable calamity was to be prevented for the future it could only be through the beneficent operation of the League of Nations.. Critics of the League had no substitute for it. What was wanted was public opinion behind it, and that all the Powers, especially the Great Powers, should take an equal share in the burden the League would throw on them. If one nation began to make reservations, others would inevitably copy. Equality of effort would be lost, and the outlook for the League dark

The Douglas Pennant Inquiry Committee found that the allegations against Col. Janson, Miss Glubb, Col. Bersey, and General Livingstone, were untrue. There was no evidence in support of the charges of immorality at Hurst Park or other W.R.A.F. camps.

1,400 men came out at the G.S. and W. waggon works, Inchicore, yesterday. The goods service from Dublin was stopped, and it is feared that the passenger service may be interfered with. A worker already belonging to a Trades Union declined to join a union to which the strikers belong, and the company declined to interfere.

The London Stock Exchange closed very weak yesterday on fears of still dearer money. War Loan fell to £91 3s 9d, Victory Bonds 81, Coats £8 13s 9d (the Dublin price was £8 16s 3d). Oils slumped badly at the end. Colonel Seely has resigned from the Air Ministry.
