



> Broadly speaking, the purpose of the first Bill, which is the ninth amendment of the Constitution proposed by the present Government, is to remove from the Constitution all the remaining references to the King and the Governor-General.

> It abolishes the office of Governor-General by deleting in its entirety the Article providing for his appointment and remuneration.
