HUNGER-STRIKE IN CORK

Forty Political Prisoners Cease to Take Food as a Protest

FERMOY BOY ALREADY WEAK

: It was learned yesterday afternoon that about forty tried and untried

political prisoners had gone on hunger strike in Cark gael. They include Fermey prisoners, Mr. Frederick Murray, who was nominoted for the Cork Corporation, and is standing on the Sinn Feln ticket, and the four boys from Lough district who are awaiting trial in connection with

The reason given by the untried men for going on strike is that on Thursday last one of the Fermoy prisoners, John J. Horgan, was removed from the others for some cause of which they are ignorant. He went on hunger strike on Sunday night as a protest, and in this the other untried men

joined on Mondoy. They number from 16 to 20. The tried prisoners, who are receiving ameliorative treatment, number about 20. They went on hunger strike yesterday morning. The reason for so acting is because a prisoner named Hennessy, from Fermoy, who, on the 19th of last month was sentenced to a term of imprisonment for a speech he made at Watergrasshill, was not given treatment similar to theirs. Hennessy is on

hunger strike since 12 o'clock yesterday. Alderman Kelleher, Pisiting Justice, visited the prisoners yesterday and found them cheerful and well, with the exception of Horgan and Hennessy,
