The Alderman, who refused to recognise the court, was undefended. The jury again disagreed, and the trial was adjourned to next Assizes. At the same Commission the trial of John Joseph Madden for the murder of Sergeant Philip Brady at Lorrha, Co. Tipperary, was, in view of rew evidence, postponed till the 22nd inst. During the day the precincts of the court were guarded by armed military and constables; also, armed military occupied the

In his address to the Grand Jury, Lord Chief Justice Molony deplored the state of the Assize district. Quite recently, he said, Mr Alan Bell was the victim of a cold-blooded atrocity, which was seldom exceeded in the annals of crime.

Early yesterday morning French troops, mainly cavalry, to a strength of from 15,000 to 18,000, occupied Frankfort, Darmstadt, and other towns of the Ruhr district. The German attitude is one of complete surprise, as they claim that their troops were performing only police duties. They declare that the French action endangers the German Republic, and makes good relations with France impossible.

Lord Grey vigorously supports Mr. Runciman for the Edinburgh seat. He declares for Mr. Asquith's policy as against the Coalition, saying that, without independent criticism in Parliament, all Government is likely to deteriorate, and confidence in Constitutional methods is undermined.

At the National Teachers' Conference in Dublin, the President's address dealt with the Education Bill.

At the inquest on civilians shot at Portobello, Dublin, it was stated that a mixed crowd of stragglish soldiers and civilians was fired into by the relief cyclist party, numbering 16; and Lieutenant Dawson, who gave the order to fire, said it was necessary under the circumstances. It was denied that the bullet found in the man's body was from a military rifle.
