A Motorist's Handbook.

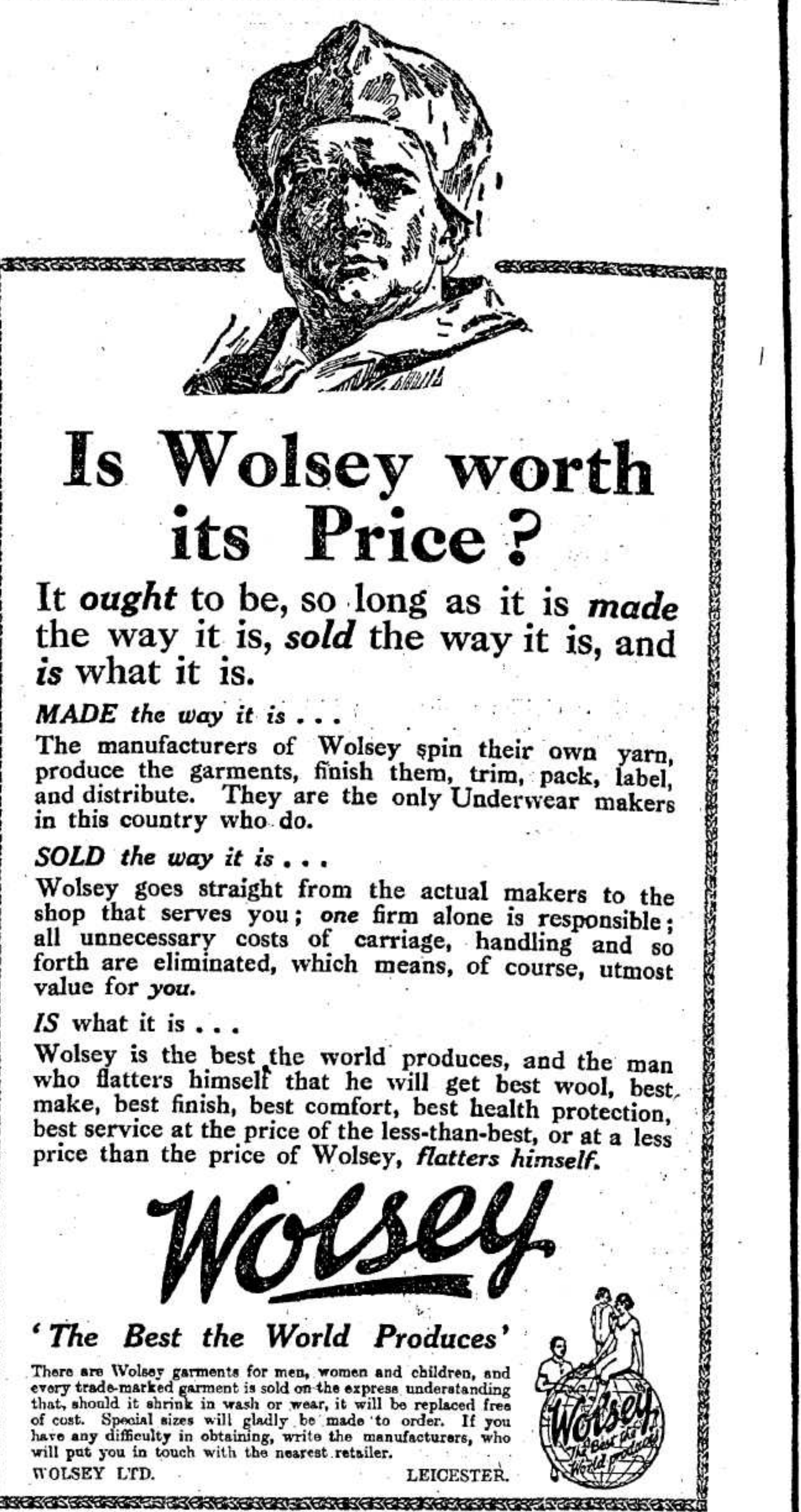
