## ACTIVITY IN THE NORTH

Rev. M. Morley, C.C., Headford, was arrested on Wednesday and removed to Galway jail, as a result, it is stated, to the finding of a shotgun and ammunition in his house. This is the first time for many years that a priest has been arrested.

The residence of Mr. Max Green, Rathmines, son-in-law of the late Mr. John Redmond, was raided by military on Monday night.

Mr. Green is Chairman of the Irish Prisons Board, and the only explanation of the mysterious visit is that some practical joker communicated with D. W. Ross.

Mr. Green, who lodged a complaint, has had some papers returned.

Mr. D. McCullagh, T.C., Belfast, was arrested in a private hotel in Dublin yesterday morning. Mrs. Coffey's house, 51 Pembroke Rd., was twice raided within 35 hours, both raids lasting close on 3 hours.

The first visit was paid to the place at 1 a.m. on Wed., the household at the insistence of Mr. N. Watson, and Mr. Neil Watson, and Mr. Neil Watson, a number of men were seen moving about the back garden, and a member of the household asked what they were doing, but got no reply. A motor lorry with several soldiers, a policeman, and 3 others had appeared at the front door.

When the raiders were admitted, they made a thorough search, removing letters and upsetting the place considerably, though attempts were made before they withdrew to tidy up some of the rooms.

Shortly after noon yesterday another party of soldiers again remained until 2 p.m. They asked for Mr. Figgins, who, however, was not there. They again carried out a systematic examination of all the rooms. Mr. Henry Nevinson, the well-known English correspondent, and Miss Chenovix French, grand-daughter of Dr. French, Protestant Archbishop of Dublin, were in the house at the time.

A quantity of private correspondence, some address books, and a collection of foreign visiting cards were the most interesting articles, including a pipe of little value, were missed when the soldiers had left.
