MARTIAL LAW. PROCLAMATION BY THE LORD LIEUTENANT. Dublin, Saturday morning. A Proclamation, signed by Viscount French and issued last night, imposes Martial Law upon the following areas: County Cork, East and West Ridings, County of the City of Cork, County Tipperary, North and South Ridings, County Kerry, County Limerick, County of the City of Limerick.

Further Tragedies. STORIES OF SHOOTINGS, ATTACKS AND AMBUSHES DURING WEEK-END. AMBUSH NEAR ENNISTYMON. THREE OF THE ATTACKERS REPORTED KILLED. TWO SOLDIERS SHOT. Civilians Killed After Arrest in Tipperary.

News reached Ennis early on Saturday morning that a lorry containing police and military was ambushed at Gallary's Cross, about a mile-and-a-half from Ennistymon by a party of about 100 men. Many shots were exchanged. The military returned the fire of the ambushers with a Lewis gun. Some relief parties which had been rushed to the scene had returned to Ennis at the time the message was despatched on Saturday. It was stated that four of the military and two policemen were wounded—some very seriously.

THREE ATTACKERS REPORTED KILLED. Dublin, Monday morning. A message received from Ennistymon last night states that five of the soldiers were wounded in the attack, and it is reported that three of the attackers were killed. TWO MEN SHOT AT CASHEL. Two men named James Looby and Wm. Deery, were shot dead on Saturday night. Details of the tragedy have not yet come to hand. It is, however, stated that the police knew that the two dead men and another prisoner left Cashel in motors, and that the tragedy appears to have occurred on the return journey.

FATHER OF SEVEN KILLED. News of a shocking tragedy comes from the district between Farranfore and Scarra Glen, Co. Kerry. It is stated that a man named O'Connor, a small farmer, the father of seven children, was shot dead. Particulars are lacking. CONSTABLE SHOT DEAD. News has reached Ennistymon that a police patrol was ambushed near Swanlinbar, Co. Cavan, on Friday night. Constable Shannon was shot dead, and Constable Monaghan and Constable Byrne were wounded.

BALLYJAMESDUFF ISOLATED. Sensational reports were current in Kells on Saturday concerning a daring raid on Ballyjamesduff police barracks. The town is situated on the borders of Meath and Cavan, and the barracks was occupied by twelve policemen. All roads leading to the town were barricaded with fallen trees, and consequently all details were lacking. Another Death in Cork. ATTACK ON WEXFORD POLICE BARRACKS. According to a report received at Dublin Castle, Foulksmills (County Wexford) barracks was attacked at 2.30 on Saturday by a party of about seventy men who had with them three motor cars. The attackers used bombs and rifles for about twenty-five minutes, after which they were repulsed. No casualties were sustained by the police, who captured a quantity of bombs and arms, and one of the motor cars used by the attackers. "HOSTAGES" IN LORRIES. STEP TAKEN BY BRIGADIER IN THE SOUTH OF IRELAND. A Mayor Utilised to Prevent Ambushes. Brigadier-General H. H. Cunningham, commanding the Kerry Infantry Brigade, has issued a proclamation stating that owing to the treacherous attacks by armed civilians on military and police convoys travelling by road from to-day (Monday), I.R.A. officers or leaders who are taken into custody will be sent as hostages with all transports carrying forces of the Crown and proceeding by road in the areas under Martial Law. Nearly a fortnight ago Alderman de Loughrey, the Mayor of Kilkenny, which has been singularly free from outrage throughout, was taken and no news of his whereabouts could be obtained by his relatives, who have since learned that he is being taken around to military and police lorries as a "hostage" against an ambush of the troops at Green's Hill, occupied by the wife of a policeman stationed at Goresbridge, has been burned down.

FATAL DRUNKEN ROW. MAN SUFFERS TO INJURIES RECEIVED AT CROSS ROADS FIGHT. WIDOW'S EXPERIENCES. ATTACKED WITH ASP PLANT WHEN TRYING TO SAVE HUSBAND. Woodford Men Tried by Courtmartial.

A general courtmartial held at Remount Barracks, Dublin, on Saturday morning, tried the case of Bernard MacCabe, Owen MacCabe, and James Seymour, Woodford, Co. Galway, who were charged with the manslaughter of Thomas King, of the same place, on August 23 last. Mr. Bewley, B.L.O., presided. The court was a military court, the Major stated, and courts of military inquiry are not open to the Press.

District-Inspector Shot Dead After Leaving Sweetheart. HENRY-STREET TRAGEDY. Finance's Struggle With Armed Man. Dublin, Saturday morning. District-inspector Philip J. O'Sullivan, R.I.C., son of Mr. P. O'Sullivan, of Kinsale, who was engaged at the Assistant-Inspector-General's Office at Dublin Castle, was shot dead in Henry-street, Dublin, not far from Nelson's Pillar, about six o'clock last evening. At the time of the tragedy he was in the company of Miss Moore, to whom he was engaged. His fiancée had just left her place of business.

SHOCKING TRAGEDY IN BEDROOM. A shocking tragedy, involving the death of an ex-serviceman, was caused by a fall from a bed in a room on Sunday morning.
